

CHANGES TO WA LIVESTOCK SALE DAYS

Elders, Landmark, Primaries and Westcoast Livestock are proposing to change livestock sale days across Western Australia.

These changes have been prompted by the difficulties and cost of sourcing labour on a Sunday to prepare cattle for sale at the Muchea Livestock Centre. Consequently, any change to selling days at Muchea will have a 'knock-on' effect at other saleyards.

The livestock agents are intending to conduct sales to the revised schedule below, commencing on Tuesday 7 April 2015;
